## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Part of the fun of being an artist is to become part of an art community. The art community includes amateur artists, people who have been professional artists for years, art supplies, art collectors, and foundations who support art through their gifts and grants.

Over the past two years the Pocatello Art Center has received grants totaling over \$15,000 enabling us to expand and enhance programming. We received three grants from the Idaho Community Foundation with funds coming from the F. M. Anne G., and Beverley B. Bistline Foundation. Beverley was a former state legislator and attorney from Pocatello who strongly believed that the artistic growth of a community was as important as its economic growth, and she became well known in and around Pocatello for her commitment to the arts during her lifetime.

Bistline grant monies have helped fund the High School Invitational Art Show, Children's Art, and the Center's Legacy Project. The Legacy Project is being created to pay tribute to the artistry of southeastern Idaho artists who have achieved significance and prominence in their artistic endeavors. I was privileged to know and work with Beverley and I believe she would be pleased with the manner in which her gifts to the Center have been used. We have also received two grants from the Spaulding Foundation for the High School Student shows and for the first time in 2015 and 2016, we were able to offer monetary prizes to the top student winners. Each year, more than 100 pieces from area high school students in drawing, painting (watercolor, oil, and acrylic), mixed media, sculpture, pottery, computer art, and pastels were entered each year. The judges this year (Torgesen Murdock, Frank Hartlieb, and Carol Myers) said the depth and maturity of students' designs and compositions were at an amazing level of competence. Speaking for the students whose work we displayed and their art teachers, I again acknowledge and thank the Spaulding Foundation for funding this project. We look forward to our high school show in March, 2017.

Further, the Pocatello Arts Council helped the Pocatello Art Center with a grant to support its summer Children's Art Education Program. Through grant funds, we purchased markers, clay, paint, paper, display boards, and other art supplies needed to offer classes throughout the summer. Five different artist/teachers offered classes for children 6-12 years of age. The sustainability and expansion of our program was greatly enhanced with the addition of supplies provided through these funds.

As an all-volunteer organization the Pocatello Art Center relies on the generosity of these grants to fund many of its programs. We also rely on the largess of individuals, businesses, and various organizations to support our activities and art classes. To keep the Center running we use funds from the classes offered, rent from the apartments above the Center, our membership dues program, and other individual gifts to the Center. We are also planning an art/garage sale August 13<sup>th</sup> to raise maintenance funds as we are always fixing a leaky roof or sink, refurbishing an old worn-out floor, or replacing a water-heater.

Most importantly, in closing I would like to offer a huge "thank you" to the a forward-looking group of former Presidents, board members, and volunteers who in the past gave of their time and money to secure the purchase of the Pocatello Art Center building for use by all of us today and in the future. It is a treasure!

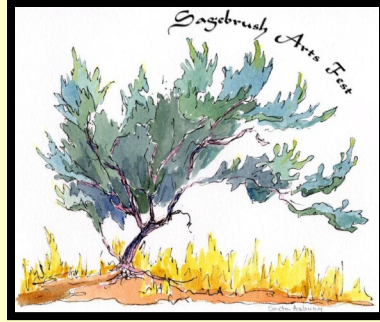

Featured in the show is "The Creation" by Torgeson Murdock as the winner of the Juror's Choice Award. Also, featured in the Traveling Show is "The Geisha" by Carol Myers who won the Ann Bessee Memorial Award. Both artists are Distinguished Merit Members.*

POCATELLO ART CENTER BOARD MEETING, MINUTES  
July 7, 2016

\*President Jennifer Fisher called the meeting to order at 10:15am.

\***Present:** Jennifer Fisher, Carolyn Purnell, Sallee Gasser, Pat Geiger, Wayne Millyard, Dorothy Brzek, Georgia Orwick, Barbara Orr, Barbara North, MaryAnn Hoffman, Roger Boe, Rick Aubrey, Peggy Anderson, Jeanne Hand, Becky Petersen, Carolyn Purnell, Barbara Santos and Linda Groom were excused.

\***Minutes:** There were no minutes from the June meeting because it was the Annual Luncheon.

\***Treasurer's Report:** The expenses exceed the income because of plumbing problems in the apartments. Next month we will still be paying for some repairs. The water heater in Apt. 3 needed to be replaced. Because of the leak, tiles in the classroom needed to be replaced. The water heater in Apt 1 also needed to be replaced. It was an expensive because it is an unusual size. A pipe also burst that caused some damage. It took \$2000 to pay for repairs. Fortunately, the new classroom floor had been dry by one day before the last water problem that leaked onto the floor. The books for PAC are currently with the accountant to be audited. That is a cost of \$700.

\*Wayne Millyard's comments: The water heater in Apt 2 needs to be checked and when it's 7-8 years old, replace it before there becomes a problem. The water leaks cause damage and cost a lot to repair. It was replaced 2-3 years ago.

\*When there are building maintenance problems in the future, Wayne will be notified and he will deal with the property management company.

\***Insurance:** Sallee has paid the insurance premium with State Farm for the month of July. State Farm has said they cannot insure PAC without fire escapes from each of the apartments. Wayne talked to the fire department. They strongly suggested hiring an engineer to plan the escapes. That can cost a lot of money. Barbara Orr said we are grandfathered in, but could be in trouble if we start adding upgrades. After the discussion, it was voted on and decided to go back to the old insurance company. They have agreed to take us back. Becky will talk to the insurance agent and get things settled there. This will give PAC time to look at options and may talk to State Farm in the future.

\***Finance Committee:** The Finance Committee will meet to discuss next year's budget. They see the budget as a plan for the next year. Jennifer suggested that if you are the head of a committee and need some money, please talk to the Finance Committee.

### Committee Reports

\***Publicity:** The Publicity Committee puts in a press release for each week for the month. There is a new contact person at the ISJ who Barbara Orr is working with. Barbara Orr went to the State to get permission to put a 4'x8' sign up on the corner of Oak and Yellowstone for a month to advertise for Sagebrush.

\*Channel 8 came down and gave some publicity on the Legacy Project.

\***Correspondence:** Peggy sent at least 5 notes last month. One was for Jerry Younkin Griffin's birthday.

\***Desk:** Linda is not here today, but there is a need for a new person at the desk on Wednesday mornings.

\***Sagebrush:** There are 22 vendors signed up. The food vendor we were going to have will be at the State Fair. Please let Carolyn know if anyone has ideas for a food vendor. If we can't find anyone, we will have no vendor. Jennifer asked everyone on the board to look for a food vendor and come back with ideas.

\*Frank Hartleib was going to work on getting music. There are volunteers for the Children's Art Yard. Volunteers are needed for Hospitality and the Information Booth.

\*A large job is getting advertising out to surrounding areas. We may need to take out advertisements in the papers. We may need to do interviews with radio stations. Social media may be a good way to get out the information.

\*Jennifer asked Barbara Orr to work with Carolyn to come up with a plan for advertising.

\*There will be fewer mini booths this year. One will be used for art sculptures.

The tents have been reserved.

\***Newsletter:** The newsletter is going quite well. Carolyn needs the information by the 15th of the month. If anyone is a Chairman of something, e-mail Carolyn and she will add you to her reminder list.

\***Education:** The Pocket Sketch class August 9-10 has some openings. The instructor will take 15. It will be held for two days from 9-4 in the gallery.

Kathleen Torgeston-Murdock is interested in doing a seminar in the spring. She suggested February or March. It will be a Thursday-Saturday. Those present at the Board recommended a March date.

\*Any recommendations for classes, e-mail Carolyn at capur007@msn.com.

\***Gallery:** The last two shows have been a little slim in the number of entries. It is nice to have people bring their artwork. We have sold a photograph and two paintings. We have sold some pottery and some jewelry. Rick Aubrey's Teton painting could have been sold, too.

## **Minutes continued:**

**Maintenance:** Wayne gave Jennifer a comprehensive report on the process and cost for re-doing the classroom floor. The original cost estimate was about \$600. The actual cost was \$1046. There was a total of \$2500 approved for the floor. Wayne made a recommendation that PAC pay the people who helped with the project. There were several man-hours involved and a lot of heavy work.

\*Pat Geiger moved that we accept Wayne's recommendation that we pay the volunteers who helped with the floor. Rick Aubrey second. There was discussion of how the pay will be done, and the possibility that some people will want the money donated back to PAC. It was decided to pay them by the hour. Wayne kept track of the hours that were worked. Pat amended the motion to pay the volunteers \$10/hour to those who helped with the project. Rick Aubrey second. The Motion passed. Wayne has the authority to contact the volunteers about payment.

\*Jennifer thanked Wayne on behalf of PAC for the work he has done.

\*Rick suggested we look at sealing the floor because of the marks that are showing up. He suggested Wayne look into this. Wayne will also look into sliders for the small art tables.

\***Hospitality:** We were a little short on the food for First Friday. Dorothy Brzek will work on stocking the pantry. There was some talk about moving the food table to the classroom. The Hospitality Committee would prefer to have the table in the gallery.

\***Fund Raising:** The next meeting will be Friday, July 8 at Ruby Tuesday. They will be working on the Garage Sale. They have some raffle items. Jennifer called the State Tax Commission. PAC is allowed to have a lottery. She also called the Lottery Commission. We don't have to report anything to them. However, we do need to keep good records and keep them for 5 years. We can have up to 12 lotteries per year. Each item raffled is allowed to be sold for up to \$1000 without reporting it.

\***Legacy:** They are working on 2 shows. The next show will be the September First Friday. It will feature William White and possibly an additional wood carver. There will be a show with a large separate reception on a Saturday featuring Clara Knapp, Barbara Ruffridge, and possibly two others. Roger Boe is currently photographing items.

\***IWS:** Their program is on hiatus for the summer. Some of them have started a sketching club. Georgia was accepted into the IWS show. Kathleen Torgeson-Murdock received the Juror's choice award for her full sheet painting.

\***PVPS:** The photography club has had a slowdown in summer attendance. The First Saturday Safaris have been cancelled for the summer. They will be planning a safari to the abandoned Indian Rocks State Park. Club meetings are the fourth Thursday of each month at PAC. Barbara Orr is willing to do press releases for the club.

\***PASI:** They are having a seminar next week at Dorothy Chatterton's studio. They are bringing in an artist from Texas. She is known for roses. August First Friday is the PASI Art Show. They will have tables set up.

## **Unfinished Business:**

\***Website Development:** Please look at the website and see what Barbara Santos has added. You can now pay your dues on-line.

\***Nominating Committee:** Linda Groom was appointed as the Chairman of the Nominating Committee for new Board Members. A list of potential board members has been made. Many have been contacted and are interested. If anyone has someone they want to nominate, please get the names to Jennifer for Linda in the next two weeks so they will have names to present at the next board meeting.

## **New Business:**

\***Master Calendar:** It would be good to create a master calendar of when things need to be done at PAC and events that are happening.

\***PAC Board Member's Retreat:** Jennifer is a big retreat person. She is suggesting that the Board have a retreat where we can review the Mission and By-Laws, look at roles and responsibilities of each committee, who should write grants, plan for the year, look at where we are and where we want to go, how do we feel about various classes, various issues, parking tickets, etc.

Becky made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Wayne Millyard second.  
Meeting adjourned at 12:20pm.
